CUPS TO BE AWARDED

(All winners receive a certificate)

- The Royal Horticultural Society's Banksian Medal, to the winner of the highest number of place points in the whole of the horticultural classes in the show.
- Llewellyn Cup for the highest number of points in the Flower, Decorative, Fruit and Vegetable Sections.
- Burt Challenge Cup for the Long Sutton parishioner gaining most points in the Flower, Fruit and Vegetable Sections.
- Gardening Club Cup and Prize of £2 for the Gardening Club member with the highest number of points in classes 1 – 44, excluding 16-19.
- Challenge Bowl to the member of Long Sutton Women's Institute who gains the most points in the Flower, Fruit and Vegetable Sections.
- Thorlby Cup to the member of Long Sutton Women's Institute who gains the most points in the Culinary, Decorative and Handicraft Sections.
- The Sylvia James Cup for the most outstanding article in the Handicraft Section.
- Cup for the highest number of points in the Culinary Section.
- Cup for the best exhibit in the Pot Plant class.
- A Prize of £5 each for the most outstanding exhibit in the Flower and Vegetable Sections respectively.

Flower Section

- 1 Rose, one bloom, any colour
- 2 Vase of one kind, three stems, annuals
- 3 Vase of one kind, three stems, perennials
- 4 Three blooms of dahlias, decorative
- 5 Three blooms of dahlias, cactus or semi-cactus
- 6 Vase of mixed flowers of one colour/hue only
- 7 Vase of sweet peas, five stems
- 8 Vase of mixed flowers, mixed colours
- 9 One stem, any flower. Bulb/Corm
- 10 One stem, any flower. Non-bulb/corm
- 11 One pot plant. Foliage
- 12 One pot plant. Bloom. Excluding Begonias and Fuchsias
- 13 One pot of Begonias
- 14 One pot of Fuchsias (not more than 23cm/9in pot)
- 15 One pot Pelargoniums

Decorative Section (Measurements include container)

- 16 5 blooms, plus any foliage. Space allowed 45cm/18in
- 17 Posy for top of Royal Wedding Cake. 20cm/ 8in maximum
- 18 Wild flower arrangement. Space allowed 45cm/18in
- 19 A basket of foliage. Space allowed 45cm/18in

Vegetable Section

- 20 Pair of vegetables, greenhouse grown (other than 21-39)
- 21 One cucumber, indoor
- 22 One cucumber, outdoor
- 23 Three beetroot, round
- 24 Five white potatoes
- 25 Five coloured potatoes
- 26 Pair of courgettes, 10-15cm/4-6in
- 27 Five carrots, long
- 28 Five carrots, other than long
- 29 Three onions
- 30 Three onions which will go through a 3in ring
- 31 Five medium tomatoes

Shortbread Recipe (Men only)

Ingredients

225g (8oz)	Plain flour
100g (4oz)	Semolina (this gives a crisper texture)
225g (8oz)	Butter
100g (4oz)	Caster sugar
25g (1oz)	Sugar for dusting (Demerara or caster)

Method

Preheat oven to 160C/Fan 140C/Gas 3

Lightly grease a 30cm x 23cm (12" x 9") tray bake or roasting tin

Mix together the flour and semolina in bowl or food processor

Add butter and sugar, rub together until just beginning to bind

Knead lightly forming a smooth dough

Press dough into tin, level evenly with palette knife, prick with fork

Chill until firm

Bake for about 35 minutes or until golden brown

Sprinkle with sugar and leave to cool in tin for a few minutes

Cut into fingers or squares and carefully lift out with palette knife

Finish cooling on wire rack. Store in airtight tin

SHOW RULES

1. Entry forms will be received at the village hall from **6 - 7.30pm on Thursday 9th August. No late entry forms will be accepted.**
2. Entry fees: 25p per entry up to and including 10 entries. 15p per entry thereafter. Children's section, no fees. Exhibitors entering 15 or more entries will receive free admission to show.
3. Entries to be staged either on **Friday evening from 6.30 - 7.30 pm** or on **Saturday morning from 8.30 - 9.45am**. Doors locked at 10.00am sharp.
4. Where entries are small in any one class the judges may use their discretion as to the awarding of more than one prize.
5. No exhibit may be removed before 4.30pm, after which all exhibits must be removed.
6. Please put your name on all vases, plates etc. in such a way that names are not visible to the judges. The Committee will not be responsible for any items lost.
7. Except for classes 16 - 19, **all exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor.**

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
